Dayalbagh Educational Institute (Deemed to be University), Dayalbagh, Agra-282005, has signed a Letter of Intent with Purdue University, West Lafayette, Indiana, USA and the University of Connecticut, Storrs, Connecticut, USA on 23rd January 2024. A delegation comprising Dr. Indrajeet Chaubey, Dean, College of Agriculture, Health and Natural Resources, University of Connecticut, Dr. Bernard Engel, Glen W. Sample Dean of Agriculture, Purdue University, Mrs. Engel (wife of Dr. Engel), and Dr. Dharmendra Saraswat, Associate Professor at the Department of Agricultural and Biological Engineering, Purdue University, visited DEI on 22nd and 23rd January 2024.

The visiting delegation took a round of the Institute and expressed tremendous appreciation for the DEI Yamuna River Restoration Site (*Vaikunth Dham / Swarg Dham*), Poiya Ghat, Agra. They also visited Dayalbagh's Agroecology-cum-Precision Farming Fields, Dayalbagh Colony, Gaushala and Dairy Complex and various laboratories and facilities on the campus. From the Coordinator's desk

The National Education Policy 2020 (NEP 2020) was launched by the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India on July 29, 2020.

The Cambridge University of England lauded the Policy and honoured the then Union Education Minister Shri Ramesh Pokhriyal 'Nishank' for spearheading Education Reforms to build a 'coherent and resilient education system', and appreciated him for his commitment to sustainable education through NEP 2020. It was further stated that for the last seven decades, India has largely



focused on expanding access to education. Now, with the recently launched NEP 2020, the focus has rightly shifted to the curriculum, pedagogy, and assessment reforms. It promises to move the education system towards real understanding, away from the culture of rote learning. The policy has been well-received by educationists and other stakeholders in India and is being implemented quite effectively.

As an illustration, I will pick up degree-level <u>undergraduate (UG) programmes</u> in which NEP 2020 has introduced considerable flexibility, as described below:

While earlier, the UG programmes were of 3-year duration, NEP-2020 proposed two types of UG degree courses – of 3 or 4-year duration, with multiple exit options within this period, with the appropriate certification, e.g. a certificate after completing one year in a discipline or field including vocational professional areas or diploma after two years of study or a Bachelor's degree after a three-year programme. The four-year multidisciplinary Bachelor's programme, however, shall be the preferred option since it allows the opportunity to experience the full range of holistic and multidisciplinary education.

Since less than 5% of the workforce in India in the age group of 19-24 has received formal vocational education as opposed to 52% in the USA, 75% in Germany, and 96% in South Korea, it was decided that vocational education will be integrated into all school and higher education institutions in a phased manner. The skill enhancement courses are aimed at imparting practical skills, hands–on training, soft skills, etc. to enhance the employability of students.

Against this backdrop, it is worth pointing out that Dayalbagh has been a pioneer in providing vocational education and training in India. The Model Industries were started in October 1917 in Dayalbagh. Manual training after school hours was started for selected students in the Model Industries workshops in 1921. Thus for more than a hundred years, vocational training has been an integral part of our education system in Dayalbagh. As noted in DEI's Prospectus for the Session 2023-2024 (page no 85):

'For the last several years, the DEI has emerged as the largest vocational training provider in the country. The DEI has also been recognised by the MHRD and the U. P. Govt. as one of the government training provider agencies. The Dayalbagh Educational Institute has started B.Voc programmes in six trades from the session 2015-16 and one from 2016-17. Now 22 B.Voc programmes are being run by the Institute. These programmes will ensure that the students graduating in these trades possess adequate knowledge and skills. The University has already acquired state-of-the-art infrastructure in terms of training equipment, human resources, industry partners, and a quality education framework. With multi-point entry/exit and progressive education system, the curriculum designed by the Institute supports the development of individuals in realizing their potential and needs.'

The canvas of degree-level UG courses as proposed by UGC, based on credit mapping as per NEP 2020, is very broad and comprises several categories of courses as noted below:

Overall the National Education Policy 2020, which aims to develop good, thoughtful, well-rounded, and creative individuals through multidisciplinary and holistic education, as noted by the Chairman, UGC, has been very well received by educationists, though some concern has been expressed [1] that (a) the emphasis placed on skill education and on categories of education other than the major area is high, and (b) emphasis is high on employment and low on innovation.

Now My birth, triumph and fruitful, With shadow of Fear faded And Kal Karma defeated.


