School News


DEI Prem Vidyalaya:

From the Coordinator's desk

In the December, 2020 issue of the erstwhile DEI-DEP News, I wrote in these columns about the e-book entitled "The Case for Climate Capitalism - Economic solutions for a planet in crisis" by Dr. Tom Rand, which was introduced to us by the Most Revered Prof. P.S. Satsangi Sahab, Chairman of ACE by reading the Preface of the book in a special meeting of ACE held on 4th December, 2020. He highlighted those aspects which showed identity in our views in DEI with those of the author-for example, his statement that while commerce will be the tool for high finances,



The Illustrated Oxford Dictionary describes the earth as the fifth largest planet in the solar system which has four main layers: a solid metal inner core, with a temperature of about 4000 °C; a molten outer core; a mantle composed largely of rock; and the crust, of which there are two different types, continental and oceanic.

In earth science, global average surface temperature is calculated by averaging the temperature at the surface of the sea and air temperature over land [1]. The reliable measurement of the global temperature started in 1880. Between that year and 1940 the average annual temperature increased by 0.2 °C. The temperature was then stable between 1940 and 1970. Since 1970, it has increased by 0.18 °C each decade. The average global temperature has increased by 0.9 °C compared to the baseline temperature [1] which is about 14 °C. As pointed out by Dr. Tom Rand, at 3.5 °C global warming level, Greenland will be gone, Florida will be under water, the US mid-west will be a desert, Pakistan will be parched and Australia and California on fire.

A "Distinguished Lecture" was recently organized by DEI with support from SPHEEHA, DRSAE CIO and SSI on 7th January, 2023 – the speaker was Dr. Michael Grubb, Professor of Energy and climate change in University College, London and the Lead author of IPCC (Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change) 6th Assessment Report, chapter on Mitigation. He spoke on 'Energy, Climate and the Economics of innovation' in the video-conferencing mode.

The Learned speaker made the following noteworthy observations:

- Emissions in 2019 were about 12% higher than they were in 2010 and 54% higher than in 1990.
- The temperature will stabilize when we reach net zero carbon dioxide emissions. India plans to be net zero by 2070.
- In every sector (Energy, Land use, Buildings, Industry, Urban and Transport) there are options available that can at least halve emissions by 2030 and keep open the possibility of limiting warming to 1.5°C.
- An increasing range of policies and laws have enhanced energy efficiency, reduced rates of deforestation and accelerated the deployment of renewable energy and continuous efforts to be made with the objective of limiting warming to 1.5°C.
- We are not on track to limit warming to 1.5°C.

Against this backdrop it may be noted that Dayalbagh has been a great believer in green energy. In the area of renewable energy, we are now touching 1MW generation capacity. Reduction of carbon footprint and making sustainability a way of living through Sigma 6Q for everyone have been a part of the visionary mission of our Revered Leaders. Battery-operated vehicles ply in the colony. Green gas is used for cooking. The colony has been developed as an eco-village with a lot of greenery including herbal gardens.

Large-scale tree plantation and bio-diversity parks are the other noteworthy expressions of the green mission.



Good Times and New Ways of Learning at DEI: A Reminiscence Urvashi Kaushal, Currently, Assistant Professor of English, SVNIT, Surat Batch: B.A. English (1998), M.A. English (2000), PhD (2004)

When I look back at the nine years I spent at DEI, I am assured that they were the most defining years of



my life. Being a student of BA English (Hons), then MA English, and finally a PhD scholar of DES Block, DEI moulded me in many ways.

The institute equipped me with knowledge and many life skills, unlike other universities, which focused only on classroom knowledge. I realized this when I talked to my friends who were studying in different institutes. While teachers at DES Block, as the Department of English at DEI was popularly called, inculcated the ability to critically appreciate the nuances of language and literature, the institute's rigorous curriculum instilled discipline and sincerity, which became a way of life. But the most significant contribution of education at DEI, which I began to appreciate once I became



a teacher, was the mandatory presentations that were the norm in the undergraduate programme. It was and I still believe, is the best pedagogical tool for developing the student's confidence, clarity, and communication skills.

I hope DEI still has presentations as a compulsory evaluation component and that self-study Seminars in the master's degree programme are still a sacred ritual attended by all the teachers. I am grateful to the DEI system of education, which has inadvertently inculcated many life skills such as overcoming stage fright and developing the ability to express ourselves clearly, present ideas with confidence, and discuss them. These skills are integral to employment, which people otherwise either learn on the job or with help from professional trainers. But DEI does it effortlessly in the classroom, within the curriculum, thereby giving its students an edge over others.
