Bicentennial Celebration of Founding of Radhasoami Faith - The Ultimate Reality

[Evolution of Radhasoami Satsang Way of Life: A New World-Order (Economy, Polity and Spirituality)

The Life and Teachings of Param Purush Puran Dhani Huzur Soamiji Maharaj] Landmark Workshop in Central Satsang Hall Dayalbagh (Closing Function) August 24, 2018

To mark the closing of the momentous bicentennial year (2017-18) of the advent of Param Purush Puran Dhani Huzur Soamiji Maharaj on this planet Earth in 1818, in commemoration of such an epoch-making event unparalleled in human history, a Landmark Workshop was organized jointly by Dayalbagh Educational Institute and Divinity Study Forum, Radhasoami Satsang Sabha at Central Satsang Hall, Dayalbagh with the President of DEI and RS Sabha, Mr. Prem Prashant in the Chair. The Workshop involved noted scholars from all over the world who have extensively studied Radhasoami Faith and its August Founder such as Prof. Mark Juergensmeyer, University of California at Santa Barbara, USA; Prof. David Christopher Lane and Prof. Andrea Diem Lane, both from Mt. San Antonio College, California, USA. Prof. Peter Roe, University of Waterloo, Canada joined the Workshop through video-link. Delegations from other Radhasoami centres also joined the celebrations in a feeling of brotherhood at the invitation of President, Radhasoami Satsang Sabha. The visiting delegations included those from Radhasoami Satsang Beas led by Mr. J.C. Sethi, Secretary; Sawan Kirpal Ruhani Mission led by Mr. I.R. Malik, Head Foreign Office; and Huzuri Bhawan, Peepal Mandi (Agra) led by Mr. Sumir Mathur, grandson of Revered Dadaji Maharaj. The Radhasoami Satsang Sabha delegation was led by Mr. Prem Prashant, President. The morning Satsang was









also attended by the Revered Leader of Radhasoami Satsang Dinod (Bhiwani), Revered Kanwar Singh Maharaj with a large contingent of followers.

Vision Talk entitled, "Complete Neuro-Theology as Ultimate Reality: Science of Consciousness" was delivered by Most Revered Prof. Prem Saran Satsangi Sahab. The Souvenir-cum-Abstract Book of the Workshop is a compilation of all the Vision Talks delivered by Most Revered Prof. Satsangi Sahab from 2003 till 2018 with power point slides and photographs. The full transcript of this Vision Talk will also be published separately. A presentation was made by Mr. Prem Prashant, President DEI and RS Sabha and Member, Divinity Study Forum on preliminary analysis of

spiritual experiences compiled in a study by the Divinity Study Forum detailing evidences of the boundless mercy of Most Revered Prof. Satsangi Sahab on the community. Lunch was hosted by Revered Leader of Dayalbagh for all visiting delegations seated in a round-table mode with nearly 10,000 Satsangis joining in the grand feast. Panel Discussion moderated by Mr. Prem Prashant was widely appreciated by the visiting delegations as very illuminating. The Workshop was transmitted to over 400 branches and centres in the e-Satsang cascade. The evening Satsang that followed in continuation of the Workshop was also attended by the delegations from Beas, Sawan Kirpal Ruhani Mission and Huzuri Bhawan, Peepal Mandi.

The Workshop carried forward the integrationist efforts started by Murar Declaration in June 2010 for promoting brotherly relations among all Radhasoami centres, followed by SPIRCON and Conclave of Leaders of various Radhasoami sects in November 2010 and visit of Revered Leader of Beas Satsang to Dayalbagh in March 2011. Sant Rajinder Singh Maharaj of Sawan Kirpal Ruhani Mission also visited Dayalbagh in February 2018 to promote this feeling of brotherhood among Radhasoami communities.

Student-Exchange Programme Between DEI and Hongkong University

10 Students from Arts, Social Sciences, Engineering & Technical college with 2 faculty members from Arts & Science went from 4th June to 15th June 2018 to visit the Hongkong University. The objectives of the exchange were to understand the teaching, learning, and research cultures of the University and to gain first-hand experience of the culture of Hong Kong while also facilitating cultural exchange and bonding between students from India and Hong Kong.









During this visit, workshops with subthemes on "Nature and the City"& "Mapping Hong Kong Experience" and guided tours led by academics from HKU were organized. The students were provided with exploratory visits through different parts of Hong Kong where they got a taste of local culture. Activities such as map making, snapshots, short writings, drawings, and mobile phone video production were

organized to allow students from HKU and DEI to exchange ideas on their understanding and perception of Hong Kong through their first-person experience.

HKU students are expected to visit DEI in a few months time for training in skill development with vocational education mainly in Agricultural operations and Textiles with regular Yoga practice for 2 weeks.
