DEI, NDRI (Karnal) Sign MoU

Expanding its domain of research fields, DEI has recently signed an MoU on Oct, 3, 2015, with National Dairy Research Institute at Karnal, Haryana, to foster study and research in linked fields at both the Institutes. Prof. P.K. Kalra, Director, DEI and Prof. A.K. Srivastava, Director of NDRI, represented their institutes and signed the document. Following this, Prof. Srivastava, while delivering a Special Lecture, spoke on the subject, "Science and Technology and its Active Contribution in Development of Indian Dairy Industry". He also applauded the steps taken by DEI in the field of advanced research to promote Dairy Technology.



Later, the visiting Guests from NDRI were honoured with Mementos presented by Director, DEI.

Diamond Jubilee Memorial Lecture, 2015

Attempting to address the questions that are raised time and again about the origin, nature, and fundamental forces that govern this complex Universe, Professor Ashok Sen, Fellow of the Royal Society and renowned Professor of Physics, Harish Chandra Research Institute, Allahabad, recently delivered a thought provoking and knowledge-enhancing DEI Diamond Jubilee Memorial Lecture at DEI on Oct. 5 Oct., 2015.





In his Lecture on the topic “String Theory & Cosmology : Tying the Two Ends”, Prof. Sen expounded that this Universe, which is understood to be three-dimensional, is actually a single dimensional object. He also observed, “ *Our Universe is not stable and it is changing with time. Cosmological constant has accelerated the growth of the Universe, which proves the authenticity of the Big Bang Theory.*” Later, he went on to add that the Big Bang Theory also has some limitations and in order to understand the Universe

completely, one must understand the String Theory. The audience was deeply mesmerized by the thoughts enunciated by Prof. Sen and his Lecture was highly commended. In the Convocation Hall, where the lecture was organized, Prof. Anand Mohan, Registrar of the Institute, while giving the background of the Diamond Jubilee Memorial Lecture, highlighted the objectives and philosophy of the lecture. The Director of the Institute Prof. P.K. Kalra introduced the Speaker to the members of the audience.
