Report on the One Day Workshop on Rorschach Inkblot and Somatic Imagery Tests (R&SibT, 2025) by Prof. B.L. Dubey organised by the Department of Psychology, Faculty of Social Sciences, DEI

A\_One Day Workshop was organised on 12<sup>th</sup> April, 2025 by the Department of Psychology, Faculty of Social Sciences, Dayalbagh Educational Institute (Deemed to be University), Dayalbagh, Agra on the theme, '*Rorschach Inkblot and Somatic Imagery Tests (R&SibT, 2025)*' by **Prof. B.L. 




The objectives of the workshop were: (1) To enable the students studying Psychology and Cognitive Science as their major course as well as research scholars, practitioners and educators gain an understanding of projective techniques and their applications. (2) To give clarity of information and gain experience for the conduction of psychological testing of projective technique online, specifically Somatic Imagery test(SIT) that is an online version of conduction of a projective technique and interpretation of responses even using AI programming as an option. (3) Learning to interpret the responses and assess the personality of individuals accordingly. (4) To make the students aware of the use and application of SIT in counselling and other fields like in Organisations for employees, Career counselling, Family Counselling, Relationship issues in marriage counselling etc. for all across different age groups. Fifty-one participants (mainly students) participated in offline mode and fourteen participants were present online.



After the inaugural session the next session started with and introduction of projective techniques including Rorschach Inkblot test and demonstration of the conduction of SIT was done for the audience with one of the student volunteering to be the subject for taking the test online. A comparative analysis of different projective tests was also presented with regards to the scoring of responses and ease in administering the test, for a deeper insight.





**Prof. B.L. Dubey** had an interactive session with the students and answered the queries of the students regarding practice effects of the test and the type of expertise required in interpreting the results. The questions regarding the application of the test worldwide were also aptly delt during the session by the resource person. Both the academic sessions of the workshop were reported interesting and highly appreciated by the students as per their feedback given after the completion of the sessions in the evening.
