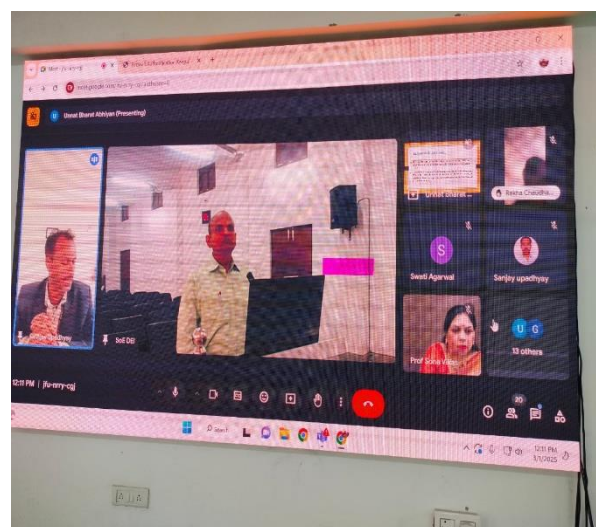
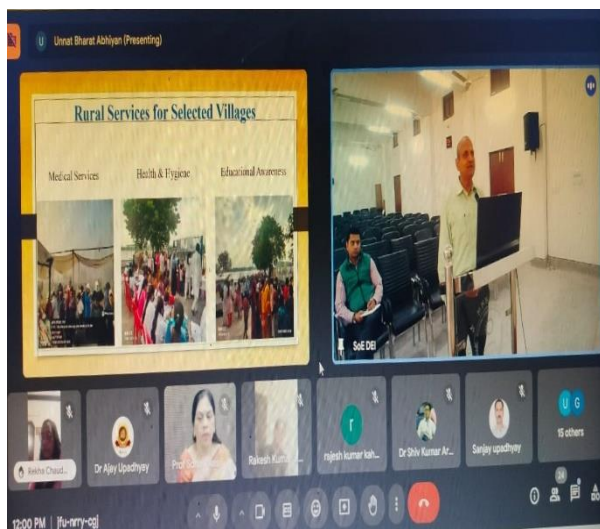
1. **Concept and Background** – A detailed explanation of the origin and purpose of the Unnat Bharat Abhiyan.

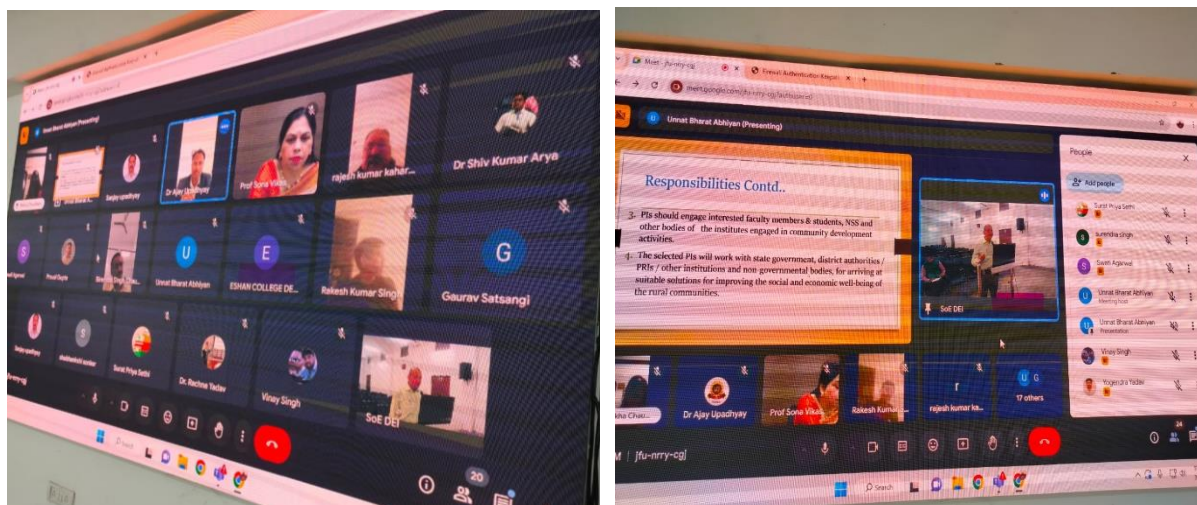
Case Study: Dayalbagh Educational Institute

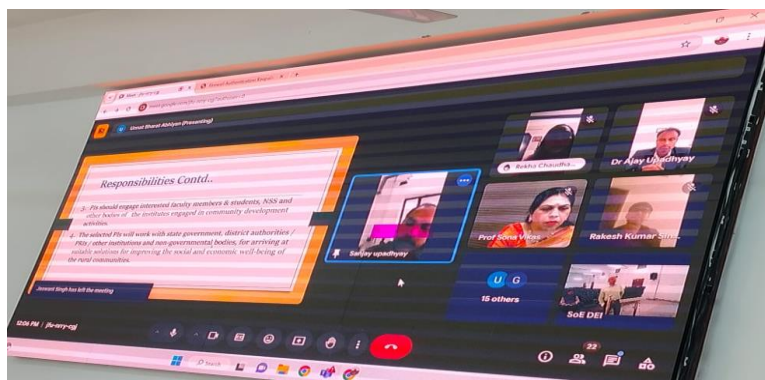
Interactive Session with Participating Institutes

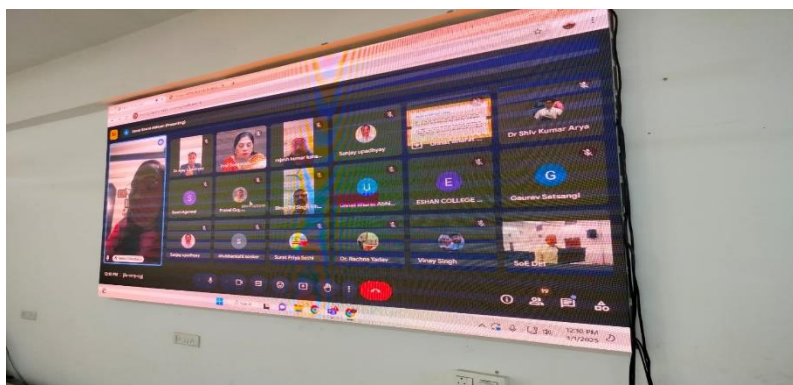


Key Highlights from Participating Institutes

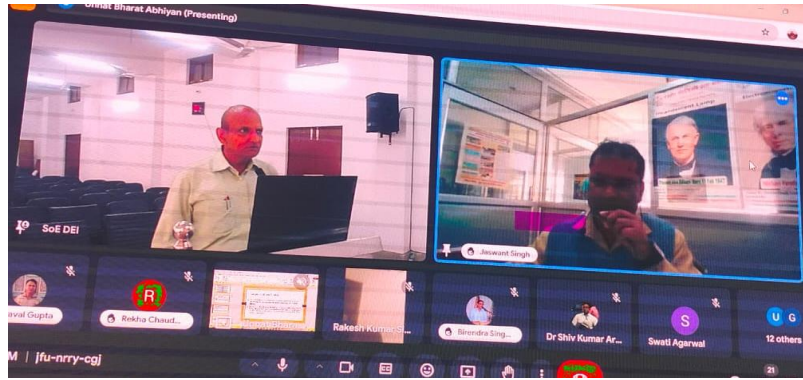
- **Mangalayatan University, Aligarh** – Dr. Swati Agarwal raised concerns regarding issues faced in conducting household surveys.



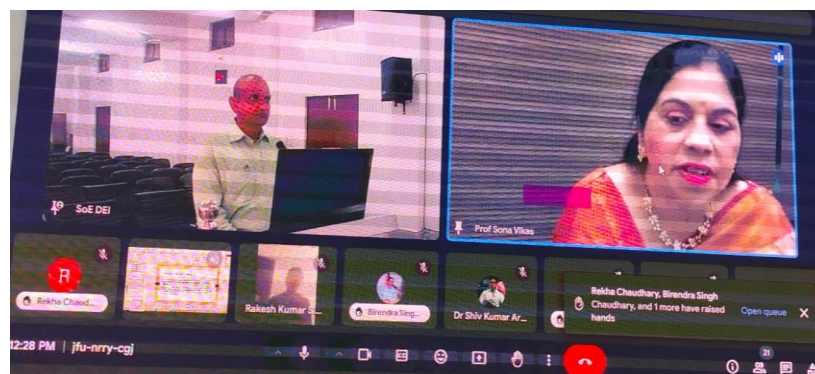

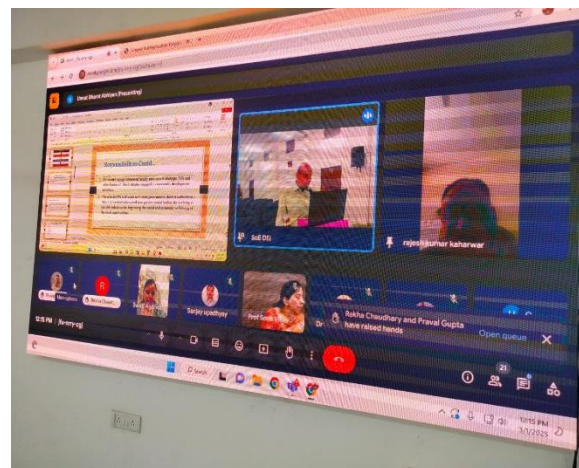
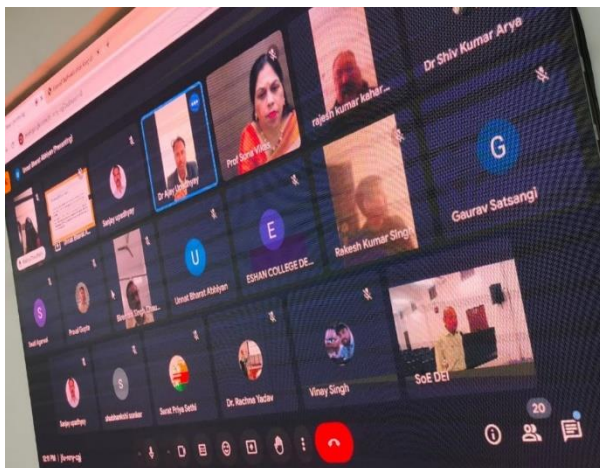
