Introduction

The Dayalbagh Educational Institute (DEI) has been a pioneer in implementing the National Service Scheme (NSS) in Uttar Pradesh since its very inception. Social service forms an integral component (under Rural Development) of DEI's innovative undergraduate education program, which seamlessly integrates academic excellence with social responsibility under its Rural Development initiative.

The vibrant and disciplined community life at Dayalbagh, supported by its diverse infrastructure in agriculture, education, and industry fosters meaningful social work in nearby villages.

Starting in 1981 with only two units of 100 students each and two project officers NSS has now expanded to 3500 students, 35 Program Officers and a Program Coordinator. Through collaborative faculty efforts, the Institute has significantly advanced NSS and Rural Development. NSS camp participation is mandatory for all first-semester students.

Overview of the Camp:

This year the National Service Scheme (NSS) camp was organized by Dayalbagh Educational Institute (DEI- deemed to be university) from 14th to 24th December 2024. It aimed to instill a sense of community service and social responsibility among students. The focus of the camp revolved around practical contributions to sanitation, education, environmental conservation, cultural enrichment and awareness of government schemes. These activities reflect the core values of NSS to engage youth in constructive societal development

Objectives of the Camp

The National Service Scheme (NSS) aims to nurture students' personalities through active engagement in community service. To achieve this objective, student volunteers and program coordinators participate in various constructive and impactful initiatives. These include awareness campaigns, voluntary work (shramdaan), promoting social reforms, fostering communal harmony, building community assets, providing relief during emergencies, organizing blood donation drives, environmental conservation, literacy promotion, and health education campaigns. Each volunteer is required to dedicate 240 hours to community service over a two-year period, contributing meaningfully to both the personal development and societal progress.

Location

The camp was held across multiple locations in and around rural areas of Dayalbagh Agra, including villages and community centers. The camp was conducted across 21 distinct sites and thoughtfully selected to cater to the diverse objectives and activities planned, ensuring meaningful engagement and a broad community impact. Sites like Basera, Nagla Boori, Nagla Talfi Yamuna river bank, Nagar Panchayat, Dairy and others were chosen for their relevance to the camp's objectives. Basera served as the site for environmental conservation initiatives, while Nagla Talfi was chosen as a site for river cleanliness. These locations were strategically selected to address specific community needs and amplify the impact of the camp's activities. The rural and semi-urban settings provided a meaningful backdrop for participants to understand and tackle grassroot issues. The NSS activities organized in local villages went a long way on fostering a sense of understanding and mutual exchange thereby enhancing the relationship between students and the community.

Significance of the Camp

The camp served as a holistic platform for participants to contribute meaningfully to society while gaining valuable life experiences. Activities such as cleaning roads, waste management, and health awareness drives emphasized the importance of sanitation and hygiene in daily life. The interaction with local residents during these tasks provided participants with insights into real-life challenges, broadening their perspectives. Environmental conservation efforts, such as tree plantation and awareness campaigns, reinforced the need for sustainable practices. Moreover, the educational sessions highlighted critical issues like women empowerment, cyber safety, and civic duties; thereby preparing students to address contemporary societal concerns.

By integrating community service with cultural and educational programs, the NSS camp bridged diverse fields, encouraging students to become well-rounded individuals. The rural setting of Dayalbagh allowed participants to experience grass root realities and develop practical solutions, fulfilling the NSS's goal of nurturing students to become responsible and resourceful citizens.

Camp Activities

The seven-day special NSS camp was organized from 14th to 24th December 2024 at 21 different sites by involving 3500 NSS student volunteers and 35 program officers and other helpers.

The daily schedule for the NSS camp began with prayers, attendance, and work allocation. The prayer was followed by the university song and NSS song – "*Utho samaj ke liye utho utho …*" and slogans instilled students with confidence and motivation to begin the work. Students engaged in social service at designated sites. After the lunch break, sessions were dedicated to special lectures, awareness programs on government schemes and cultural competitions.


6. Community Support:

These activities reflect the holistic approach of the NSS camp, addressing social, environmental, and cultural aspects while fostering community engagement.

FOOD PREPARATION

During the 7-day NSS camp, meal preparation became a vital task to serve 3500 students, 35 program officers and additional staff. Students along with their mentors and helpers, eagerly took the responsibility of preparing the meals. Guided by the program officers, the students took the initiative to cook the food themselves, with a new menu every day. The girls rolled out puris and cut vegetables, while the boys along with helpers cooked the food. Students also volunteered to serve the food and the menu was decided collaboratively by the students and their mentors. The food included dal, vegetables, puris, and sweets like halwa and kheer. The in-house food preparation reduced costs, ensured better cost efficiency and maintained hygiene standards under careful supervision. Beyond saving time and resources, the experience taught students valuable life skills such as teamwork, coordination, and time management. Most importantly, the students thoroughly enjoyed the process, learning to make food and take responsibility, making the entire experience a rewarding and educational one.



It is evident from these images that the Camp initiative successfully accomplished daily cleaning drives, tree plantation, health awareness workshops, educational sessions, and cultural programs. Specialized workshops on skill development, health camps, and awareness programs were conducted. Community engagement was emphasized through feedback sessions and active participation, fostering collaboration and strengthening the bond between villagers and organizers.
