NSS IN DEI

The DEI Education Policy was conceived, planned, formulated, crystallized and executed by the Supreme Teacher and Founder Director of Dayalbagh Educational Institute in the year 1975. The Government of India promulgated its National Education Policy in 1986. A comparison between the two reveal various common aspects implying the Education Policy of DEI anticipated eleven years earlier those aspects beneficial to the country which were incorporated in the National policy of Education later in 1986.

This Institute has been pioneer in implementing the scheme since its inception in UP Social service is an integral component (under Rural Development) of DEI's program of innovative and comprehensive undergraduate education, which combines academic excellence with social relevance.

Ambience of an active, disciplined, socially sensitive and co-operative community life and work ethic at Dayalbagh with its multi-faceted infrastructure of agriculture, education and industry, provide the basic thrust for social work in surrounding villages.

Starting with only two units of 100 students each and two project officers in 1970 the Institute has 1600 students on roll in NSS with 16 Program Officers and a Program Coordinator. With the coordinated effort of all the faculties, multi-pronged efforts have been made to make a more effective contribution towards rural reconstruction. Participation in NSS Camp is compulsory for all students in the first semester of their course of study.

NSS in DEI aims at is developing personality of students through community service. In order to fulfill the objective, student volunteers and program functionaries are engaged in constructive and productive programs involving students in various Awareness Drives, Shramdaan,

Cleanliness Drive, Social Reforms, Communal Harmony, Creation of Community Assets, Relief Work, Blood Donation, Environmental Protection, Literacy Programme, Health Education Campaign, etc.

NSS is one of the essential components of the curriculum of the Institute. The performance of the volunteers is evaluated through a compulsory course at UG level. The break-up of marks for evaluation is as follows.

ONE DAY NSS CAMPS

The NSS Volunteers of the Institute took active part in several One Day NSS Camps organized on different dates during 2015-16. Each NSS Volunteer took part in four One Day NSS Camps. The activities conducted in this Camp included Cleanliness on Roadsides towards adopted villages and Slums and also inside adopted villages and Slums, Free Medical Camp for people of adopted villages and Slums, Recreation and Literary Activities for Children of adopted villages and Slums, Rural Assistance and Chaupal, and Vocational Training for Youth of adopted villages and Slums.

INNOVATIVE PROGRAMS

FREE MEDICAL AND RURAL ASSISTANCE CAMPS (FORTNIGHTLY IN NEARBY RURAL AREAS)

The NSS Cell of the Institute initiated program of organizing Multi-specialty Free Medical Camps and Hole in the Wall Program fortnightly in nearby rural areas on 27th June 2010. These Medical Camps are organized in association with the Doctors and Para-medical staff of the Saran Ashram Hospital, Dayalbagh, Agra. The team of doctors in these camps comprises of (1) General Physicians (2) Surgeons (3) Heart Specialists (4) Eye Specialists (5) Child Specialists (6) Dentists (7) Tuberculosis Specialists (8) Physiotherapists (9) ENT Specialists (10) Gynecologists (11) Pathologists and (12) Radiologists.

Apart from this Specialists from the field of Ayurveda and Homeopathy also render their services. The facilities provided to people in these Camps include (1) Free Medical Check-up (2) Free Pathological tests - Hemoglobin, Blood Sugar, Blood Culture etc. (3) Free ECG and Ultrasound and (4) Free Medicines.

Hole in the Wall program (an activity to facilitate children of the nearby rural areas to develop basic computer knowledge/ skills), are also organized during the Camp. In this program, children of nearby villages are provided computers to develop basic computer skills. These children are made aware of health, hygiene, sanitation, pollution, and environment protection with the help of documentary films. They are also entertained with the help of Rhymes and folk songs.

From 7th December 2014 (111th Camp), the NSS wing of the Institute, added new activities to the Free Multi-specialty Medical Camps for overall development of the rural children, youth and old age people. These apart from Free Medical Services and Hole-in-the-Wall Program, include Children Recreation Facilities, Center For Spoken English, Education & Career Counseling Cell, Rural Assistance Cell (advisory services on Agriculture, Dairying and other local problems), and Chaupal (for developing culture and ethics among people of nearby rural areas). The detailed description of these services is as follows.

1. FREE MEDICAL CENTER

Objective: To provide Multi-specialty free medical facility to people of nearby rural areas.

2. HOLE IN THE WALL PROGRAM

Objective: To facilitate children of the nearby rural areas to develop basic computer skills.

3. CHILDREN RECREATION CENTER

Objective: To provide recreation facilities to children of the nearby rural areas and develop their basic skills.

4. CENTER FOR SPOKEN ENGLISH

Objective: To enable children of the nearby rural areas to develop basic knowledge of English and conversation.

5. RURAL ASSISTANCE CENTER

Objective: To understand basic problems (related with Agriculture, Dairying, Water, Power, Sanitation etc.) of people in nearby rural areas and to help/ offer most feasible solution to them.

6. EDUCATION & CAREER COUNSELING CENTER

Objective: To counsel and guide youth of nearby rural areas about education options/ centers, and employment opportunities. The people (male and female both) are also offered Skill Development Programs offered in the Institute.

7. CHAUPAL

Objective: To develop culture and ethics among people of nearby rural areas through discussion.

8. VOCATIONAL TRAINING CENTER

Objective: To train and develop skills among rural youth and women in various vocational programs, such as stitching, sewing, textile printing, soft toys making, food processing and preservation etc.

Above activities are organized with the help of: (i) Team of Doctors and Para-medical Staff associated with Saran Ashram Hospital, Dayalbagh, Agra, (ii) Faculty Members and Staff of the Institute, (iii) Scientists from Other Reputed Institutions/ Research Organizations, (iv) NSS Functionaries (Program Officers and Staff) and (v) NSS Volunteers on the Institute

During these camps NSS Volunteers also organize Awareness Programs on various issues, viz., Cleanliness (Swachhata), Health, Hygiene, Malnutrition, Sanitation, Pollution and Environmental issues, Social Issues, Family Planning, Literacy, Women Empowerment, Beti-Bachao-Beti-Padhao, Voting Rights, Ill-effects of Parthenium, Evils of Evils of Tobacco, Smoking, Drug Addiction, Critical health issues, e.g. Tuberculosis, AIDS, STD etc. through Discussion, Posters, Banners and Pamphlets.

These Camps are highly appreciated by Government Officials, Medical Practitioners, Social Activists, Dignitaries of NGOs, Scientists from Government Research Institutions (DRDO, CDRI, IARI etc.) and also Visitors from France, US, Germany etc. They interacted with villagers, students and beneficiaries in the camp and congratulated NSS, DEI for working for the under-privileged.

This year, Dr. Ram Shankar Katheria, Minister for States, Ministry of Human Resource Development visited various activities organized in 123rd Free Medical & Rural Assistance Camp. He interacted with villagers, students and beneficiaries in the camp and

congratulated NSS, DEI for working for the under-privileged. The 124th Free Medical & Rural Assistance Camp was highly appreciated by Student Representatives from Hong Kong University. They also interacted with villagers, students and beneficiaries in the camp and appreciated the efforts of DEI-NSS in rendering Help and Support to people of nearby rural areas.

The 125th Free Medical & Rural Assistance Camp organized on 9th August 2015 was graced by the presence of Most Revered Prof. P. S. Satsangi, Chairman, Advisory Committee on Education, Dayalbagh. The beneficiaries (villagers) from these camps during 2014-15 are as follows.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS

SEVEN DAY NSS SPECIAL CAMP (23-29 DECEMBER, 2015)

A Seven Day NSS Special Camp in the Institute was organized from December 23-29, 2015 with the theme "Youth for Cleanliness".

INAUGURAL FUNCTION

The Inaugural Function of NSS Seven Day NSS Special was organized on December 23, 2015. Prof V. B. Gupta, Professor (Retired), Delhi University, Delhi and Coordinator, DE-DEI was the Chief Guest of Inaugural Function. The function was graced by the Director, Authorities and Officials of the Institute. Apart from this a number of Invitees, Guests, NSS Program Officers, Staff and Representatives of adopted Villages and Slums elevated the enthusiasm of NSS Volunteers on this occasion. Prof. Swami Prasad Saxena, NSS Coordinator of the Institute briefed about the activities to be conducted during the camp.

The Camp activities were conducted in Two Sessions. First Session was devoted to Activities in adopted Villages and Slums, and Second Session was dedicated to Literary and Cultural Activities.

(A) SESSION I

The major activities were conducted in adopted villages and slums. These included Nagla Haveli, Sikander Pur, Bahadur Pur, Nagla Jageshwar, Lashker Pur, Jagan Pur, Nagla Talfi, Nagla Boori, Nagla padi, Durga Nagar, Devi Nagar, Vidya Nagar, Kaushal Pur, Lashkar Pur, Basera Saran Ashram Nagar and Agra Cantt. Railway Station.

Apart from this, NSS Volunteers also organized Cleanliness Movement at Agra Cantt. Railway Station, Agra. The Activities in Adopted Villages/ Slums and Agra Cantt. Railway Station included:

- 1. The Cleanliness Drive:** It included (i) Cleaning of Platforms, Waiting Space and Open Yard outside Agra Cantt. Railway Station, (ii) Cleaning and Fumigation of Drains in Adopted Villages and Slums, (iii) Cleaning of Roads and Public Places, e.g. Schools, Hospitals, Community Parks etc. in adopted Slums and Villages.
- 2. Children Awareness/ Development Program:** It included (i) Children Literacy Campaign, (ii) Basic Knowledge/ Computer Skills to Children through Hole-in-the Wall Program, (iii) Children Awareness about Health, Hygiene, Sanitation, Environment Protection etc. through Animated/ Documentary Film Shows.
- 3. Job Training/ Skill Development Programs:** This program was conducted with the help of Life Long Learning and Extension (LLLE) Section of the Institute. These included Skill Development Programs for Housewives, School Dropouts and Children of Adopted

Villages and Slums, such as Craft Work, Use of Waste Material, Making of Soft Toys, and Handmade Decorative Items.

4. **Social Awareness Programs:** The NSS Volunteers under guidance of Program Officers and deputed Teachers organized social awareness programs on various issues. The modes used for Awareness Campaign included Interaction/ Discussion, Rallies, Street Plays, and Folk Songs. These programs were conducted on (i) Health, Hygiene and Malnutrition, (ii) Child Education and Recreation (including Computer Literacy), (iii) Beti Bachao–Beti Padhao Movement, (iv) Women Harassment and Safety (including Self Defense), (v) Environment Protection, (vi) Family Planning & Social Issues, (vii) Voting Rights, (viii) Evils of Tobacco, Smoking, and Drug Addiction, and (ix) Critical Health Issues e.g. Tuberculosis, AIDS, and STD.
5. **Social Survey & Help:** The NSS Volunteers conducted Socio-economic Survey on about 300 Households of adopted slums by using Structured Questionnaire, and distributed Old Clothes, Toys and Books to people/ children of adopted slums.

(B) SESSION II

In the second session, NSS Volunteers enthusiastically participated in Literary Activities conducted on important issues, Invited Talks by Eminent Personalities, and the Cultural Activities on various Social Issues.

6. **Literary Activities:** These included Poster Making, Slogan Writing, Essay Writing and Speech Competition organized on Smart City, Traffic and Road Safety, Make in India, Self Defense, and AIDS and STD.
7. **Invited Talks:** To make NSS Volunteers more responsible towards society, some Eminent Personalities of Agra including Social Activists were invited to deliver Expert Talk on various critical and social Issues.
